The Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation achieves its mission of helping children in need by partnering with Lions clubs, zones, and districts throughout Multiple District 20 through our Grant Program. The Foundation awards up to \$2,000 matching funds for Standard Humanitarian Grants and up to \$2,500 in non-matching Emergency Grants. With our new Major Grant program, we are now able to award \$10,000 to \$20,000 in matching funds for qualified projects.

Since 2011, 191 grants have helped over 250,000 children with over \$330,000 in grants awarded. As we begin a new calendar year we can reflect on the success of 2024, with 19 Standard Grants awarding nearly \$25,000 in funds that will help over 14,000 children in need throughout Multiple District 20.

Examples of some of these 2024 grants include:

- assisting two backpack programs in 20-O to provide after school meals.
- providing swag bags to help brighten the treatment experience of children with cancer in 20-K2 (seen at right).
- fresh food vouchers and "Dinners4kids" for children and families struggling with food insecurity in 20-O.
- four vision screening related grants in 20-R2, 20-W, 20-E2.
- providing shoes, sneakers and coats to children in need in 20-W and 20-K1.



How To Receive Your Grant

Our Grant Committee looks forward to receiving many more grant applications in 2025 before our current Lions year concludes. On our website you will find everything you need to apply for a BMYF Grant, including your application and a simple submission process. Some helpful tips include:

- Your project should be designed to significantly help children in need.
- If you are applying for a Major Grant it must also benefit many children over a wide geographical area.
- When applying for a Standard or Major Grant, matching funds are required for grant approval.

Once your project has been approved at your board or cabinet meeting, you are ready to submit your application to the Foundation. Grants are awarded on a regular basis throughout the year.

Zone Project/Charlton School for Girls

The five Lions Clubs of Region I Zone A (Ballston Spa, Galway, Scotia-Glenville, Saratoga Springs and Town of Greenfield) joined for a Zone Service Project at The Charlton School for Girls on Saturday 10/5/24.

The school is a non-profit therapeutic learning community for high school girls with various mental health issues. As part of their high school curriculum, they have a large "Pollinator Garden" used in science classes. Over the years portions of the garden have become overgrown and need of some "TLC". Fourteen Lions representing all five clubs of the Zone united to work on a portion of the garden removing weeds, rototilling, adding five yards of topsoil (purchased by the clubs), replanting perennial plants, adding mulch that the school had and rebuilding part of the gravel walkway dividing the beds. It took approximately five hours of hard work to complete the section we selected. A couple of Lions expressed interest in coming back next year to work on another section.

An interesting note is this is not the first time Lions have stepped up to help the school's needs. In the mid-60's a 20Y2 District project raised funds to help build a swimming pool. That pool is still being used.

We filled 50 cleaning buckets, labeled large equipment, took a complete inventory and recorded serial numbers on the generators. Many hands make light work so thank you all for coming out to help. The warehouse looks great, we can find equipment and we know what we have because of the inventory. We are ready to aid the next disaster area.

This Fall when PDG Sue Piccolo in K2 gathered relief supplies, the Alert Foundation sent some equipment to North Carolina in her trucks. To replace that equipment, District 20 Y applied for an LCIF Disaster Preparedness Grant in the amount of \$14,740 which coupled with matching funds of \$4920, donated from around the MD will allow us to replace all the equipment that we sent to the flood ravaged areas in the south. Once again, MD20 showed that we are willing to help our Lions family anywhere a disaster strikes.

As we help others, it is so wonderful to witness the continued support from LCIF. We know that we don't need to worry about sending supplies where they are needed because LCIF is there to help us restock and be ready for the next disaster.
